1. CALL TO ORDER

2. PRESENTATIONS

Library Board presentation

Board Member Eric Erickson addressed the City Council and indicated the Board wanted to recognize the efforts of the Library staff. He said the Library staff offers a wide variety of programs and went above and beyond during the coronavirus pandemic in order to continue to provide quality programs to the community. He presented each of the library staff with a card and a plaque for the department. The Council thanked the Library staff for their hard work.

General Ethics and Conflicts of Interest

CA Adams provided a PowerPoint presentation associated with ethics and conflict of interest for public officials. He reviewed state laws that regulate personal/professional municipal advocacy during elections. The Council asked clarification questions to understand how the laws apply to staff in relation to political advocacy. He indicated conflicts of interest apply if and when there is a potential or actual conflict of interest. He clarified an actual conflict is when it would financially benefit to a public official and a potential conflict is if it could financially benefit a public official. He noted with an actual conflict of interest a Councilor should recuse themselves from the decision and leave the room. He said in spite of everyone in the room knowing there is a conflict of interest, it must be stated for the record. He reviewed conflicts of interest for employees and said they should inform their supervisor of the conflict and then provided examples of exceptions to conflicts of interest.

14 **Authorize Expenditure of approximately \$102,000 and approve a contract to install liners in**

16 PWD Zuspan provided the council report. He said this project would complete Projects G and L
17 from the 2011 Inflow & Infiltration Study and close all priority 1 and 2 projects on that list. He
18 said Civil West Engineering prepared a letter for the City to submit to the Department of
19 Environmental Quality, who accepted the liners as an alternative solution.

21 **Motion** – It was moved and seconded (Kamikawa/Bush) to authorize an expenditure of \$102,000
22 and approve the contract with Michels Trenchless Inc for infrastructure improvements and the
23 motion carried unanimously.

26 Mayor Cross updated the Council on a recent Oregon Mayor's Association (OMA) meeting where
27 they discussed next year's OMA conference and the upcoming League of Oregon Cities annual
28 conference. He indicated he was selected as president elect for the OMA next year.

30 LD Trusty said the Lincoln County Library District will host an event with the author of '*Mexican*
31 *Gothic*' in October. She said the drive up service is still going strong for patrons who are not as
32 mobile and will continue to be offered permanently.

34 PWD Zuspan said staff is still moving forward with installing bathrooms at Arcadia Park and are
35 currently considering designs for the facility.

37 CP Kamikawa said she received comments about cars turning left illegally onto highway 20
38 intersection near Dairy Queen.

40 Councilor Bush noted there have been illegal parking of trailers at the park near her house on
41 Douglas Street and asked if the City could install some 'no parking' signs there.

43 CA Adams said the purchase of the hotel is near closing and he is working to ensure the City
44 receives the reimbursement from the lien on the property.

46 There was discussion about the public contracting rules, the City Manager's purchasing authority.

48 It was announced there will be a Cornhole with a Cop event in October as well as a suicide walk
49 to raise awareness of suicides.

Background:

The general rule is that animals – including dogs – are considered personal property, and as such, a city wishing to regulate animals within its jurisdiction is empowered to do so under the city’s police power. The City of Toledo must not violate an individual’s constitutional due process rights by failing to establish proper hearing and appeal procedures. This animal ordinance is meant to address animal-related concerns within their community to ensure the health, safety and welfare of tenants and to preserve community livability.

The City of Toledo Charter, Chapter XI – Ordinances, Section 31, requires a copy of the ordinance is provided to each councilor, three copies are provided for public inspection in the office of the city recorder not later than one week before the first reading of the ordinance, and notice of the availability of copies is given by written posting at the city hall and two other public places in the City or by advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation in the City.

ORDINANCE NO. ____

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOLEDO CITY COUNCIL REPEALING § 4 OF ORDINANCE 820 (1966), AS AMENDED BY § 9 OF ORDINANCE 1294 (2001), AMENDING ORDINANCE 1294 (2001), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council has a duty to ensure and protect the public health, safety and welfare of all residents of Toledo; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that roaming or barking dogs – to say nothing of other kinds of animals – can be a major livability issue in city neighborhoods and create administrative headaches; and

WHEREAS, the rising popularity of keeping backyard livestock creates additional concerns, including odor and sanitation issues; and

WHEREAS, the general rule is that animals – including dogs – are considered personal property, and as such, a city wishing to regulate animals within its jurisdiction is empowered to do so under the city's police power; and

WHEREAS, the City of Toledo must not violate an individual's constitutional due process rights by failing to establish proper hearing and appeal procedures; and

WHEREAS, this animal ordinance is meant to address animal-related concerns within their community to ensure the health, safety and welfare of tenants and to preserve community livability; and

WHEREAS, because of issues that need current attention, the public welfare requires that this ordinance take effect immediately upon approval.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TOLEDO ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section § 4 of Ordinance 820 (1966), as amended by Section § 9 of Ordinance 1294 (2001), Section § 8.04.040, is repealed, as set out in Section 1 of Exhibit A of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Toledo Municipal Code Chapter 6.04, Animals, is hereby amended to read as set out in Sections 3-19 of Exhibit A of this Ordinance and incorporated by this reference as if fully set out herein.

Ordinance 2022-____ - Exhibit A

Section 1. Section § 4 of Ord. 820 (1966), amended by Section § 9 of Ord. 1294 (2001), and Section § 8.04.040 is repealed.

Section 2. Sections 3 through 19 of this ordinance are added to and made a part of the Toledo Municipal Code, Chapter 6.04, “Animals,” as indicated.

Section 3. Section § 1 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.010 is repealed, and replaced with the following in Section § 6.04.010, to read as follows:

6.04.010 – Definitions.

“Altered Dog” means a female dog that has been spayed or male dog that has been neutered.

“Animal” means any live vertebrate creature, domestic or wild.

“Animal Control Authority” means the animal control enforcement authority appointed by the City Manager.

“Animal Control Officer” or “Officer” means any sworn police officer, or any person employed or appointed by the City Manager who is authorized to investigate and enforce violations relating to animal control or cruelty under the provision of this Ordinance.

“Animal facility” means any site where animals are kept that functions as a licensed research animal facility or a government operated or licensed animal shelter or private enterprise, used for commercial purposes.

“At Large” means a dog or other animal inside the corporate limits of the City, off the premises of the owner, and not under complete control by adequate leash or voice command. Excepted from this definition are dogs in obedience or field training exercises under the direct supervision of a handler in areas designated and posted by the City.

“City” means the City of Toledo, Oregon.

“Communicable disease” means a disease carried by an animal which may be transmitted to another animal or to humans.

“Confinement area” means any site where an animal is contained or kept on private property, including grounds and housing structures.

“Control” means an animal is under control if restrained from placing others at risk, whether by physical control device, or trained to respond to verbal commands and in close proximity to and in view of the owner.

“County” means the county of Lincoln, Oregon.

“Court” means the municipal court of the city of Toledo, Oregon, or other court of competent jurisdiction.

“Dangerous Dog” means a dog that without provocation or justification bites or attacks a person and causes serious physical injury or death or is declared dangerous under this title. A dog which has bitten a human being or other animal on two occasions without provocation is presumed to be a “dangerous dog.”

“Exotic Animal” means (1) Any member of the family Felidae not indigenous to Oregon, except the species *Felis catus* (domestic cat); (2) any nonhuman primate; (3) any nonwolf member of the family Canidae not indigenous to Oregon, except the species *Canis familiaris* (domestic dog); (4) any bear; and (5) any member of the order Crocodylia.

“Household Animal” means any animal other than livestock or equines that is owned or possessed by a person.

“Impoundment” means seizing and confining a dog by any police officer, animal control officer, or any other public officer under the provisions of this Ordinance.

“Leash” means any humane device constructed of rope, leather strap, chain or other sturdy material not exceeding six feet in length, being held in the hand of a person capable of controlling the animal to which it is attached.

“Livestock” includes, but is not limited to horse, mule, donkey, cattle, sheep, goat, goose or other poultry, llama, ostrich, rabbit, excluding swine, but including fur-bearing animals bred and maintained commercially or otherwise.

“Minimum care” means care sufficient to preserve the health and well-being of an animal and, except for emergencies or circumstances beyond the control of the owner, includes, but is not limited to, the following requirements:

1. Sufficient food to maintain an animal's health.
2. Access to potable water to satisfy the animal's needs. Snow or ice is not an adequate water source.
3. Access to a barn, house or other enclosed structure for the protection of the animal.
4. Access to an exercise area on a regular basis as required for the health and well being of the animal.
5. Veterinary care to relieve distress from injury or disease.
6. Confinement area having adequate space and ventilation.

“Muzzle” means a device constructed of strong, soft material or of metal, designed to fasten over the mouth of a dog that prevents the dog from biting any person or other animal and that does not interfere with its respiration.

“Owner” means any person, partnership, or corporation having a right of property in an animal or who harbors an animal or who has it in the care of the person, or acts as its custodian, or who knowingly permits an animal to remain on or about any premises occupied by the person. “Owner” does not include

veterinarians or kennel operators temporarily maintaining on their premises animals owned by other persons for a period of not more than 30 days.

“Person” includes any natural person, association, partnership, organization or corporation.

“Potentially Dangerous Dog” means a dog that *while at large*: 1) behaves in a manner that a reasonable person would believe poses a serious and unjustified imminent threat of serious physical injury or death to a person or household animal or livestock; or 2) causes injury to a household animal or livestock.

“Provocation” means any action or activity, whether intentional or unintentional, which would be reasonably expected to cause a normal dog in similar circumstances to react in a manner similar to that shown by the evidence.

“Sanitary Condition” means a condition of good order and cleanliness to minimize the possibility of disease transmission.

“Serious Physical Injury” means disfigurement, protracted impairment of health, or impairment of the function of any bodily organ.

“Wild Animal” means a species of animal not usually domesticated, regardless of comparative docility or familiarity of the individual animal with humans, including species which are *ferae naturae*. Wild animals include, but are not limited to, wolves, coyotes, bobcats, bears, foxes, deer, and cougars.

Section 4. Section § 2 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.020 remains the same, to read as follows:

6.04.020 – Officer's authority to cite.

An officer shall determine whether a violation of any section or sections of this ordinance has occurred. The determination shall be based upon an investigation that includes observation of the location, the animal, or through the statements to an officer or other witnesses who personally observed the violation.

Section 5. Section § 3 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.030 is amended, to read as follows:

6.04.030 – Public duties.

This section expands the statutory requirements of ORS 811.710 to include wildlife as defined in this ordinance, as follows:

A. Aiding Injured Animals. Any person operating a vehicle, as defined by the Motor Vehicle Act of the state of Oregon, who runs over, strikes, injures, maims or kills any domestic, exotic or wild animal shall immediately stop, render care, and notify the owner of the animal, if known, or notify any law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in the area of the incident, and remain at the scene until released by said law enforcement agency.

B. Refusing to Assist an Officer. A person commits the offense of refusing to assist an officer if, upon command by an officer known by the person to be an officer, the person unreasonably refuses or fails to assist in effecting an authorized action or prevents another from effecting an authorized action.

C. Interference with an Officer. It shall be unlawful for any person to interfere with or hinder an officer while that officer is enforcing this ordinance.

Section 6. Section § 4 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.040 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.040, to read as follows:

6.04.040 – Owner’s duties.

A. Licenses required. Every owner of a dog that has a set of permanent canine teeth or has attained the age of six months, which ever event occurs first, shall license said dog pursuant to the ordinances of the County where the dog is normally kept. Exceptions to this requirement are dogs owned or located at an animal facility.

B. Disease Control.

1. No owner shall permit any animal that is afflicted with a communicable disease to come in contact with another animal or human that is susceptible to the affliction other than medical personnel for treatment.

2. No owner shall permit the body of a deceased animal to remain upon the public streets or private property for a period of time longer than the minimum necessary to remove such carcass.

3. Any owner of an animal shall remove excrement or other solid waste deposited by that animal on maintained areas of public property, and on private property not owned or under the control of the animal owner, unless posted otherwise.

4. Excrement, waste and contaminants shall be removed from confinement areas as often as necessary to prevent parasite contamination, reduce disease hazards and minimize odors.

5. Whenever any animal bites a person, the owner of said animal shall immediately notify the city and the county. An officer or the county animal control authority shall order the animal held in quarantine on the owner's premises or shall have it impounded and quarantined by the county for a period of not less than ten (10) days if there is no proof of current rabies inoculation.

6. Any animal that is placed under quarantine by the city or the county shall be kept separated from any other animals or people other than the owner's family or pets for a period of not less than ten (10) days.

C. Animal Housing and Restraint. If appropriate to the type of animal:

1. Animal housing structures shall be adequately constructed and maintained in good repair to protect both the animals and the public from injury, safely confine any animal housed therein, and prevent entry of other animals that may be dangerous to the animals within the enclosure.

2. Housing structures shall be dry and adequately sealed to prevent cold air and moisture from entering the enclosure. The primary enclosure for animals shall be of sufficient size to permit each

animal housed therein to stand freely, sit, turn about and lie in a normal position, unless not warranted for specific commercial purposes.

3. Confinement areas shall provide protective shading and adequate shelter areas designed to minimize harmful exposure to weather conditions for those animals not acclimatized to the environment.

4. When restraining devices are used in connection with a confinement area intended to permit movement outside the housing structure, such devices shall be adequate in strength and installed in a manner to prevent entanglement with the devices of other animals or objects, and shall be fitted to the animal by a harness or well-fitted collar, other than a choke type collar, and shall not be shorter than three times the length of the animal as measured from the tip of its nose to the base of its tail.

5. Physical control devices must be used with animals, except cats or birds, when off or outside the property of the owner unless the animal is field trained to respond to verbal or hand command.

D. Number of Dogs Permitted. A maximum number of three adult dogs and their offspring of any number up to the age of 6 months may be kept on each residential lot. No more than one female dog may be used for breeding purposes at any one time.

E. Running at Large Prohibited. No dog shall be permitted to run at large.

F. Minimum Care. No owner shall maintain a dog without providing minimum care.

Section 7. Section § 5 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.050 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.050, to read as follows:

6.04.050 - Prohibited activities.

A. Animals at Large. It shall be unlawful for an owner to permit, either by negligence or by intention, any animal to run at large, except cats or birds.

B. Dangerous Animals. It shall be unlawful to keep in the city any animal that is dangerous without a dangerous dog permit issued by the City pursuant to the requirements in subsection D of section TMC 6.04.110.

C. Public Nuisances. It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the city any animal that has been deemed a public nuisance pursuant to TMC 6.04.130.

D. Illegal Killing. Except as allowed by statute or state regulation:

1. No person shall knowingly kill an animal not owned by that person without the permission of the owner, unless it is necessary for the protection and safety of people, other animals, or the euthanasia of a sick or injured animal.

2. No person shall knowingly place food of any description containing poison or other injurious ingredients in any area reasonably likely to be accessible to any animal.

3. No person shall set any traps that are designed to kill, injure or maim an animal.

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Section 8. Section § 6 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.060 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.060, to read as follows:

6.04.060 – Impoundment.

The animal control officer or law enforcement officer may impound a dog that is in violation of this code for a period of time hereinafter specified. A daily record of dogs shall be kept at the place of impoundment and shall be made available to the public.

A. Notice. The animal control officer or law enforcement officer shall personally notify the owner of the dog of the impoundment. If the animal control officer or law enforcement officer is unable to contact the owner or if the owner of the dog impounded is not reasonably ascertainable at the time of impoundment, the animal control officer shall immediately notify the owner by certified mail, return receipt requested sent to the owner's last known address. The notice of impoundment shall inform the owner of the day that he or she may request, in writing, a hearing to contest the impoundment within 5 business days of receipt of notice.

B. Period of impoundment:

1. An unlicensed dog or a dog for which the owner is unknown which has not been redeemed within 72 hours after impoundment will be deemed property of the animal shelter, or may be sold or humanely euthanized.

2. A licensed dog or a dog for which the owner is known, which has not been redeemed within 120 hours of notification of the owner by telephone contact or by mailing of the impoundment notice may be deemed property of the animal shelter, or may be sold or humanely euthanized.

C. Fee. A fee charged against the owner of a dog who has been impounded shall be in the amount set by Council resolution.

D. Redemption. Redemption of impounded dogs shall be made by exhibiting satisfactory proof that the person is the owner, and by paying the following required fees and charges:

1. Impoundment fee;
2. Daily care fee;
3. License and rabies vaccination fees, if required; and
4. Medical care fees, if required.

E. Costs. Any costs associated with the impoundment of an animal are the owner's responsibility. Any unusual or extraordinary expenses incurred in the enforcement of this ordinance are the responsibility of the animal owner or other responsible party.

F. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control or law enforcement officer pursuant to this section must state the information set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance except that the written appeal must be received by the City within 5 business days of receipt of the notice of impoundment. For the purposes of this section, receipt of the notice of impoundment is complete 3 days after mailing or immediately upon personal notice. An owner of the impounded dog may request a hearing be held within
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10 business days after receipt of the request for hearing. Otherwise, the City Council shall hold a meeting within 30 days of receipt of the notice to determine if a violation of this ordinance occurred by a preponderance of the evidence. If the Council determines that a violation of this ordinance did not occur, the dog shall be immediately released back to the owner and no impoundment charges shall be made. The decision of the Council is final.

G. If a notice of appeal has not been timely filed or if dog which has not been redeemed after 5 business days of notification of the owner if known, or within 5 business days after impoundment if the owner is not known, the dog may be deemed property of the animal shelter, sold, or humanely euthanized.

H. No impoundment charge shall be made for dogs released after the City Council's determination that no violation of this ordinance has occurred.

Section 9. Section § 7 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.070 remains unchanged, to read as follows:

6.04.070 - Penalties.

A. Separate Violations. Each day's violation of any section of this ordinance constitutes a separate offense.

B. Violation of Sections. Violation of any section of this ordinance is a class "C" violation, unless otherwise specified.

C. Repeat Offenses. Second and subsequent violations of the same chapter of this ordinance that occur within a twelve month period are a class "B" violation, unless otherwise specified.

Section 10. Section § 8 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.080 is repealed, and replaced with the following in Section § 6.04.080, to read as follows:

6.04.080 - Dog Bites.

A. The owner of a dog that bites a human being shall immediately file a report with the animal control officer, which shall provide the time and circumstances of the bite and name and address of the person bitten, if known.

B. Any person who is bitten by a dog shall immediately file a report with the animal control officer describing such bite giving the description of the dog, the time and circumstances of the bite and the name and address of the dog owner, if known.

C. Upon notice of a dog bite, the animal control officer shall deliver written notice to the owner of the dog, if known. The owner shall thereupon be required to quarantine the dog for ten days.

D. An owner who is required to quarantine a dog shall:

1. Prevent the dog from being in contact with any other animal or person; or

2. At the owner's expense, quarantine the animal in a licensed veterinary hospital, local animal humane society, or a kennel approved by the City Manager, or designee.

E. If the dog exhibits symptoms of rabies, the owner or person in possession of the dog shall handle or dispose of the dog pursuant to ORS 433.345.

Section 11. Section § 6.04.090 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.090 - Determination of Status: Potentially Dangerous Dogs; Dangerous Dogs

A. The animal control officer may find and declare a dog potentially dangerous or dangerous if the officer has probable cause to believe that the dog falls within the definition of “dangerous dog” or “potentially dangerous dog”. The finding must be based upon:

1. The written complaint of a person who is willing to testify that the animal has acted in a manner which causes it to fall within the definition of “dangerous dog” or “potentially dangerous dog”;
2. Dog bite reports filed with the animal control officer as required by City ordinance or state law;
3. Actions of the dog witnessed by any animal control officer or law enforcement officer; or
4. Other substantial evidence admissible in court.

B. A dog may be declared dangerous under this section if the dog has within a twelve-month period attacked or killed a household animal, or livestock on more than one occasion. For purposes of this subsection only, a household animal, or livestock does not include any feral animal or does not apply where the attack was upon a household animal, or livestock that was at large or upon a household animal, or livestock that was tormenting or attacking the dog.

C. The declaration shall contain the following information:

1. Name and address of the owner of the dog if known and if not known, that fact;
2. A description of the dog;
3. Whereabouts of the dog;
4. Facts upon which the declaration is based;
5. Restrictions placed upon the dog and when the owner is not known, the intended disposition of the dog;
6. Penalties for violation of the restrictions, including possibility of destruction of the animal and fine;
7. Availability of a hearing to contest the declaration by submitting a written request to the City Council within 15 business days of receipt of the declaration; or if the notice is given by publication or posting, within 15 business days of the earlier of the date of the notice first appears in the newspaper or the notice is posted.

D. Dogs shall not be declared dangerous or potentially dangerous if the threat, injury, or damage was sustained by a person who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner of the dog, or was tormenting, abusing, provoking or assaulting the dog or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused, provoked or assaulted the dog or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.

E. Notice.

1. The declaration shall be in writing, and shall be served by the animal control officer:
 2. On the owner if known using one of the following methods:
 - a. Certified mail, return receipt requested to the owner's last known address;
 - b. Personally; or
 - c. If the owner cannot be located by one of the first two methods, publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and posting a notice on the property of the owner;
 3. Where the owner is not known: publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City.
 4. When notice is given by certified mail, return receipt requested, notice is effective when received; provided however, if delivery has been refused, notice is effective by publication or posting and whenever notice is accomplished by publication or posting the notice is effective and deemed received on the earlier of the day the newspaper is published, or the property is posted.
- F. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control officer pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

Section 12. Section § 6.04.100 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.100 - Potentially Dangerous Dog Restrictions.

- A. No person may maintain a dog declared potentially dangerous dog in violation in this section.
- B. No person owning, harboring, or having the care or custody of a potentially dangerous dog shall permit the dog to leave the owner's property unless the dog is securely leashed and muzzled. The dog may only be walked by a person who is both over the age of 18 and who has the physical ability to restrain the dog at all times
- C. All owners of potentially dangerous dogs must spay or neuter the dog and provide proof of sterilization to the City within 21 days of the animal control officer declaring the dog potentially dangerous.
- D. In addition to any other penalty for a violation under this ordinance, a court of competent jurisdiction may revoke the authority of a person to keep a potentially dangerous dog within the City.
- E. The owner of a potentially dangerous dog may apply to the City Manager, or designee to have the declaration waived after 2 years upon meeting the following conditions:
 1. The owner and offending dog have had no subsequent violations of this chapter of the code;
 2. The owner of the dog has complied with all provisions of this act for a period of 2 years; and

3. The owner of the dog provides proof to the City Manager of successful completion of a behavior modification program administered by a Certified Pet Dog Trainer (CPDT), Certified Dog
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Behavior Consultant (CDBC), or Veterinary Behaviorist, certified through the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists (ACVB) or equivalent training.

If the City Manager, or designee finds sufficient evidence that the dog owner has complied with all conditions in this subsection, the application shall be forwarded to the City Council to rescind the potentially dangerous dog declaration during its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 13. Section § 6.04.110 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.110 - Dangerous Dog Restrictions.

- A. No person shall maintain a dog declared a dangerous dog in violation of this section.
- B. All owners of dangerous dogs must spay or neuter the dog and provide proof of sterilization to the City within 21 days of the animal control officer declaring the dog dangerous.
- C. Dangerous dog permit required. In addition to a dog license, every owner of a dangerous dog shall obtain a dangerous dog permit and renew such permit each year.
- D. Issuance. The City Manager, or designee shall issue a dangerous dog permit upon application on a form prescribed by the City, payment of the license fee, and upon finding that:

1. The dog has been issued a certificate of vaccination for rabies, valid for the entire period in which the license is sought;

2. The dog has been spayed or neutered and the owner has provided proof of sterilization;

3. The owner of the dangerous dog has procured liability insurance or a surety bond in the amount of not less than \$100,000 covering any damage or injury that may be caused by such dangerous dog. The policy shall contain a provision requiring that the City be notified immediately by the agent issuing it if the insurance policy is canceled, terminated or expired. The dog owner shall sign a statement attesting that he or she shall maintain and not voluntarily cancel the liability insurance during the lifetime of the dangerous dog;

4. The dangerous dog is at all times kept or maintained in a safe manner and is at all times confined securely under the provisions of this section so that keeping the dangerous dog will not constitute a danger to human life or property;

5. Adequate safeguards are made to prevent unauthorized access to the dangerous dog by a member of the public; and

6. The quarters in which the dangerous dog is kept or confined are adequately lighted and ventilated and are so constructed that the animal can be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and the well-being of the dangerous dog is not in any way endangered by the manner of keeping or confinement.

E. Inspection. Prior to the initial issuance and renewal of a dangerous dog permit, the animal control officer shall inspect the premises subject to the license to determine if the owner of the dog complies with all of the conditions specified under this section. In addition, the animal control officer shall have the authority to inspect the premises upon the receipt of any complaint regarding the maintenance of such premises or the dog therein. If the animal control officer determines during the inspection, that any of the

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conditions specified under this section are being violated, the officer shall not issue a dangerous dog permit unless the violation is corrected within a period of time the officer shall direct not to exceed 30 days.

F. Fee. The permit fee shall be a fee of \$100 for each dangerous dog maintained on the premises subject to the permit.

G. In no event shall a dangerous dog permit be issued or renewed for the keeping of more than 2 dangerous dogs at any single location.

H. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control officer pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

I. Once a dog has been declared dangerous, it shall be kept in a secure enclosure subject to the following requirements:

1. Except when properly leashed and muzzled as provided in this section, a dangerous dog shall be securely confined inside a residence or confined in a locked pen or other secure enclosure that is suitable to prevent the entry of children and is designed to prevent the dog from escaping. The enclosure shall include shelter and protection from the elements and shall provide adequate exercise room, light and ventilation. The enclosure structure shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and shall meet the following requirements:

a. The structure must have secure sides and a secure top, or all sides must be at least six feet high;

b. The structure must have a bottom permanently attached to the sides or the sides must be buried not less than one foot into the ground; and

c. The structure must be of such material and closed in such a manner that the dog cannot exit the enclosure on its own.

The dog shall remain within the residence or enclosure except as necessary for the dog to receive veterinary care or exercise.

2. Signs. All owners or keepers of dangerous dogs shall display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public using the words, "Beware of Dog."

3. Leash. The dangerous dog shall not be allowed outside its proper enclosure unless the dog is securely attached to a leash not more than four feet in length and walked by a person who is both over the age of 18 and who has the physical ability to restrain the dog at all times. No owner shall keep or permit a dangerous dog to be kept on a chain, rote or other type of leash outside its enclosure unless a person capable of controlling the dog is in physical control of the leash.

4. Muzzle. The dangerous dog shall not be allowed outside of its proper enclosure unless it is wearing a properly fitted muzzle to prevent it from biting humans or other animals. Such muzzle shall not interfere with the dog's breathing or vision.

J. Notification of Escape. The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall notify the City immediately if such dog escapes from its enclosure or restraint and is at large. Such notification shall also be required if the dog bites or attacks a person or another animal.

K. Failure to Comply. It shall be a separate offense to fail to comply with the restrictions in this section. Any dog found to be in violation of this section shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment pursuant to section 6.04.060 of this Ordinance. In addition to any other penalty for failure to comply with the requirements and conditions set forth in this ordinance, a court of competent jurisdiction may revoke the authority of a person to keep a dangerous dog within the City.

L. A dangerous dog owner may apply to the City Manager, or designee to have the dangerous dog declaration waived after 3 years upon meeting the following conditions:

1. The owner and offending dog have had no subsequent violations of this chapter of the code;
 2. The owner of the dog has complied with all provisions of this chapter for a period of 3 years;
- and

3. The owner of the dog provides proof to the City Manager of successful completion of a behavior modification program administered by a Certified Pet Dog Trainer (CPDT), Certified Dog Behavior Consultant (CDBC), or Veterinary Behaviorist, certified through the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists (ACVB) or equivalent training.

4. If the City Manager, or designee finds sufficient evidence that the dog owner has complied with all conditions in this subsection, the application shall be forwarded to the City Council to rescind the dangerous dog declaration at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 14. Section § 6.04.120 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.120 - Livestock.

A. Complaint Based Response. Administrative and enforcement responses under this chapter are intended to be initiated on the basis of a complaint. Complaints may be filed by members of the public, by representatives of the city organization and by representatives of external agencies in a manner that shall be consistent with administrative operating guidelines. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. No person shall cause or allow the keeping of any livestock on real property within the City contrary to the provisions of this chapter.

B. Prohibited Animals. No person shall cause or allow the keeping of the following animals on real property within the City:

1. Swine;
2. Rosters over the age of 6 months;
3. Peafowl;
4. Exotic animals; or
5. Wild animals.

C. Permissible animals. Persons may cause or allow animals on real property within the City, including:

1. Horses, cows, llamas, sheep, and goats.
2. Miniature horses and pygmy goats; and
3. Chickens

D. Inspection and approval. The animal control authority, or designee, shall inspect livestock upon receipt of a complaint, and whether premises where livestock is kept are adequate, upon finding that:

1. The premises where the livestock will be kept are maintained in a sanitary condition and adequately enclosed from other persons' property.

2. The premises lie not less than 100 feet from any structure used for human occupancy or, in the alternative, the occupant and owner of such structure have agreed in writing to the applicant's keeping of livestock.

3. The premises where the livestock will be kept do not violate any City zoning or development ordinances; and

4. The barn, stable, chicken coop or other similar confinement area, as defined in this ordinance, will not cause an odor noticeable at the property line of the property; and

5. The keeping of livestock does not otherwise violate this ordinance.

E. Failure to comply with any provision of this ordinance, obtain a permit, determination, or other approval, where one is required by the Code, shall constitute a nuisance and a civil infraction. Violation of any provision of the Code or a city-issued permit enforced under this chapter may constitute grounds for revocation, nonrenewal or denial of a permit issued by the city.

D. Any violation of the code, state law or a city-issued permit that is actionable under this chapter shall constitute a civil infraction and a nuisance.

Section 15. Section § 6.04.130 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.130 – Public Nuisance.

A. An animal shall be a public nuisance under the meaning of this chapter in the following instances:

1. The number of animals maintained on any premises is found to exceed the number allowed by this chapter.

2. The animals or group of animals make loud or frequent noises that disrupt the comfort or repose of persons in accordance with a reasonable person standard.

3. The animal which through the negligence of the owner fails to maintain the animal premises in a sanitary manner to a degree that offensive odors can be detected from an adjoining street, yard, or residential unit.

4. The animal habitually escapes confinement and trespasses on private property other than its owner's or on public right-of-way.

5. The animal is found running at large.

6. The animal chases persons or vehicles on premises other than premises from which the owner of the animal may lawfully exclude others.

7. The animal damages or destroys property of persons other than the owner of the animal.

8. The animal scatters garbage on premises other than premises from which the owner of the animal may lawfully exclude others.

9. The animal bites any person or animal while unprovoked.

B. It shall be unlawful for any person being the owner of any animal to permit the animal to be a public nuisance as defined in this chapter.

C. Any person in violation of this section is subject to a penalty in an amount set by Council resolution. In addition, the City Council may direct the removal of any animal or group of animals from the City which are deemed to be a public nuisance.

D. An appeal of a decision pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

Section 16. Section § 6.04.140 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.140 – Appeals.

A. Unless otherwise specifically provided under subsection F of section 6.04.060, any person aggrieved by a decision of the animal control officer, or designee under this ordinance, may seek review of the decision by filing a written appeal with the City Council not more than 15 business days after receiving notice of the decision. The written appeal shall state:

1. The name and address of the appellant;

2. The reason given by the City for its decision; and

3. The reason the determination is incorrect.

4. In addition to the above, an appeal of a decision regarding whether premises where livestock is kept are adequate, the written appeal must also include:

a. A description of the livestock being kept or desired to be kept and the facilities for the livestock; and

b. A map showing the location of the livestock structures in relation to the property lines, abutting properties and all structures used for human occupancy;

B. The City Council shall hold a meeting within 30 days of a timely and complete written appeal to hear and determine the appeal on the basis of the appellant's written statement and any additional evidence the Council deems appropriate. If the Council decides to take oral argument or evidence at the hearing, the appellant may present testimony and oral argument personally or by counsel. The rules of evidence as used by courts of law do not apply. The appellant shall have the burden of proving the error in the animal control authority's or animal control officer's determination. The City Council shall issue a written decision within 20 business days of the hearing date. The Council's decision is final.

Section 17. Section § 6.04.150 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.150 – Severability Clause.

A determination of invalidity or unconstitutionality by a court of competent jurisdiction of any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts to this ordinance.

Section 18. Section § 6.04.160 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.160 – Savings Clause.

A prosecution that is pending on the effective date of this ordinance and arose from a violation of an ordinance repealed by this ordinance, or a prosecution started within one year after the effective date of this ordinance arising from a violation of an ordinance repealed by this ordinance, shall be tried and determine exactly as if the ordinance had not been repealed.

Section 19. Section § 6.04.170 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.170 – Emergency Clause.

This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public welfare, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. ____

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOLEDO CITY COUNCIL REPEALING § 4 OF ORDINANCE 820 (1966), AS AMENDED BY § 9 OF ORDINANCE 1294 (2001), AMENDING ORDINANCE 1294 (2001), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council has a duty to ensure and protect the public health, safety and welfare of all residents of Toledo; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that roaming or barking dogs – to say nothing of other kinds of animals – can be a major livability issue in city neighborhoods and create administrative headaches; and

WHEREAS, the rising popularity of keeping backyard livestock creates additional concerns, including odor and sanitation issues; and

WHEREAS, the general rule is that animals – including dogs – are considered personal property, and as such, a city wishing to regulate animals within its jurisdiction is empowered to do so under the city’s police power; and

WHEREAS, the City of Toledo must not violate an individual’s constitutional due process rights by failing to establish proper hearing and appeal procedures; and

WHEREAS, this animal ordinance is meant to address animal-related concerns within their community to ensure the health, safety and welfare of tenants and to preserve community livability; and

WHEREAS, because of issues that need current attention, the public welfare requires that this ordinance take effect immediately upon approval.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TOLEDO ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section § 4 of Ordinance 820 (1966), as amended by Section § 9 of Ordinance 1294 (2001), Section § 8.04.040, is repealed, as set out in Section 1 of Exhibit A of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Toledo Municipal Code Chapter 6.04, Animals, is hereby amended to read as set out in Sections 3-19 of Exhibit A of this Ordinance and incorporated by this reference as if fully set out herein.

Section 1. Section § 4 of Ord. 820 (1966), amended by Section § 9 of Ord. 1294 (2001), and Section § 8.04.040 is repealed.

~~A. No person shall maintain a pigsty, slaughterhouse or tannery, or permit livestock or poultry owned by the person to run at large within the city.~~

~~B. No person may permit any barn, stable or chicken coop or other similar structure to cause an odor noticeable at the property line of the property.~~

~~C. No person may keep roosters or peafowl.~~

Section 2. Sections 3 through 19 of this ordinance are added to and made a part of the Toledo Municipal Code, Chapter 6.04, “Animals,” as indicated.

Section 3. Section § 1 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.010 is repealed, and replaced with the following in Section § 6.04.010, to read as follows:

6.04.010 – Definitions.

“Altered Dog” means a female dog that has been spayed or male dog that has been neutered.

“Animal” means any live vertebrate creature, domestic or wild.

“Animal Control Authority” means the animal control enforcement authority appointed by the City Manager.

“Animal Control Officer” or “Officer” means any sworn police officer, or any person employed or appointed by the City Manager who is authorized to investigate and enforce violations relating to animal control or cruelty under the provision of this Ordinance.

~~“Officer” means any individual empowered by the city to enforce this ordinance.~~

“Animal facility” means any site where animals are kept that functions as a licensed research animal facility or a government operated or licensed animal shelter or private enterprise, used for commercial purposes.

~~“At Large” means off the premises belonging to the owner and not in the company of and under control of a person.~~ means a dog or other animal inside the corporate limits of the City, off the premises of the owner, and not under complete control by adequate leash or voice command. Excepted from this

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definition are dogs in obedience or field training exercises under the direct supervision of a handler in areas designated and posted by the City.

“City” means the City of Toledo, Oregon.

“Communicable disease” means a disease carried by an animal which may be transmitted to another animal or to humans.

“Confinement area” means any site where an animal is contained or kept on private property, including grounds and housing structures.

“Control” means an animal is under control if restrained from placing others at risk, whether by physical control device, or trained to respond to verbal commands and in close proximity to and in view of the owner.

“County” means the county of Lincoln, Oregon.

“Court” means the municipal court of the city of Toledo, Oregon, or other court of competent jurisdiction.

~~“Dangerous animal” means any animal which has the propensity to bite or attack any person without provocation and the capacity to inflict physical injury upon that person. It shall be presumed that any animal that has injured a human being on one or more occasions without provocation is a dangerous animal.~~

~~“Domestic animal” means any animal that is trained and kept as a pet or as livestock.~~

“Dangerous Dog” means a dog that without provocation or justification bites or attacks a person and causes serious physical injury or death or is declared dangerous under this title. A dog which has bitten a human being or other animal on two occasions without provocation is presumed to be a “dangerous dog.”

“Exotic Animal” means (1) Any member of the family Felidae not indigenous to Oregon, except the species *Felis catus* (domestic cat); (2) any nonhuman primate; (3) any nonwolf member of the family Canidae not indigenous to Oregon, except the species *Canis familiaris* (domestic dog); (4) any bear; and (5) any member of the order Crocodylia.

~~“Family” means a group of persons, whether or not related by blood or marriage, living together in a residence as a single family unit.~~

“Household Animal” means any animal other than livestock or equines that is owned or possessed by a person.

~~“Housing structure” means any contained area or structure where an animal is kept.~~

“Impoundment” means seizing and confining a dog by any police officer, animal control officer, or any other public officer under the provisions of this Ordinance.

“Leash” means any humane device constructed of rope, leather strap, chain or other sturdy material not exceeding six feet in length, being held in the hand of a person capable of controlling the animal to which it is attached.

“Livestock” includes, but is not limited to horse, mule, donkey, cattle, sheep, goat, goose or other poultry, llama, ostrich, rabbit, excluding swine, but including fur-bearing animals bred and maintained commercially or otherwise.

“Minimum care” means care sufficient to preserve the health and well-being of an animal and, except for emergencies or circumstances beyond the control of the owner, includes, but is not limited to, the following requirements:

1. Sufficient food to maintain an animal's health.
2. Access to potable water to satisfy the animal's needs. Snow or ice is not an adequate water source.
3. Access to a barn, house or other enclosed structure for the protection of the animal.
4. Access to an exercise area on a regular basis as required for the health and well being of the animal.
5. Veterinary care to relieve distress from injury or disease.
6. Confinement area having adequate space and ventilation.

“Muzzle” means a device constructed of strong, soft material or of metal, designed to fasten over the mouth of a dog that prevents the dog from biting any person or other animal and that does not interfere with its respiration.

“Owner” means any person, partnership, or corporation having a right of property in an animal or who harbors an animal or who has it in the care of the person, or acts as its custodian, or who knowingly permits an animal to remain on or about any premises occupied by the person. “Owner” does not include veterinarians or kennel operators temporarily maintaining on their premises animals owned by other persons for a period of not more than 30 days.

~~“Owner or keeper” means any individual, or group of people, that has an ownership interest in an animal; or who harbors, cares for, exercises control over or knowingly permits an animal to remain on the premises occupied by that individual or individuals.~~

“Person” includes any natural person, association, partnership, organization or corporation.

~~“Physical control device” means a collar, connected to a leash or tether made of material of sufficient strength to prevent the escape of the animal, or fenced or enclosed in a containment area so as to prevent the escape of the animal.~~

~~“Physical injury” means an act that physically damages or hurts a human or other animal causing pain, loss, or impairment of health.~~

“Potentially Dangerous Dog” means a dog that *while at large*: 1) behaves in a manner that a reasonable person would believe poses a serious and unjustified imminent threat of serious physical injury or death to a person or household animal or livestock; or 2) causes injury to a household animal or livestock.

“Provocation” means any action or activity, whether intentional or unintentional, which would be reasonably expected to cause a normal dog in similar circumstances to react in a manner similar to that shown by the evidence.

~~“Residence” means any dwelling unit designed for occupancy by a family or families.~~

“Sanitary Condition” means a condition of good order and cleanliness to minimize the possibility of disease transmission.

“Serious Physical Injury” means disfigurement, protracted impairment of health, or impairment of the function of any bodily organ.

“Wild Animal” means a species of animal not usually domesticated, regardless of comparative docility or familiarity of the individual animal with humans, including species which are *ferae naturae*. Wild animals include, but are not limited to, wolves, coyotes, bobcats, bears, foxes, deer, and cougars.

~~“Wildlife” means animals that are not domesticated.~~

Section 4. Section § 2 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.020 remains the same, to read as follows:

6.04.020 – Officer's authority to cite.

An officer shall determine whether a violation of any section or sections of this ordinance has occurred. The determination shall be based upon an investigation that includes observation of the location, the animal, or through the statements to an officer or other witnesses who personally observed the violation.

Section 5. Section § 3 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.030 is amended, to read as follows:

6.04.030 – Public duties.

This section expands the statutory requirements of ORS 811.710 to include wildlife as defined in this ordinance, as follows:

A. Aiding Injured Animals. Any person operating a vehicle, as defined by the Motor Vehicle Act of the state of Oregon, who runs over, strikes, injures, maims or kills any ~~domestic animal or wildlife~~, **domestic, exotic or wild animal** shall immediately stop, render care, and notify the owner of the animal, if known, or notify any law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in the area of the incident, and remain at the scene until released by said law enforcement agency.

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B. Refusing to Assist an Officer. A person commits the offense of refusing to assist an officer if, upon command by an officer known by the person to be an officer, the person unreasonably refuses or fails to assist in effecting an authorized action or prevents another from effecting an authorized action.

C. Interference with an Officer. It shall be unlawful for any person to interfere with or hinder an officer while that officer is enforcing this ordinance.

Section 6. Section § 4 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.040 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.040, to read as follows:

6.04.040 – Owner’s duties.

A. **Licenses required.** ~~Licensing of Dogs. A dog shall be licensed according to the laws of the county. Exceptions to this requirement are dogs owned or located at an animal facility.~~ **Every owner of a dog that has a set of permanent canine teeth or has attained the age of six months, which ever event occurs first, shall license said dog pursuant to the ordinances of the County where the dog is normally kept.** Exceptions to this requirement are dogs owned or located at an animal facility.

B. Disease Control.

1. No owner shall permit any animal that is afflicted with a communicable disease to come in contact with another animal or human that is susceptible to the affliction other than medical personnel for treatment.

2. No owner shall permit the body of a deceased animal to remain upon the public streets or private property for a period of time longer than the minimum necessary to remove such carcass.

3. Any owner of an animal shall remove excrement or other solid waste deposited by that animal on maintained areas of public property, and on private property not owned or under the control of the animal owner, unless posted otherwise.

4. Excrement, waste and contaminants shall be removed from confinement areas as often as necessary to prevent parasite contamination, reduce disease hazards and minimize odors.

5. Whenever any animal bites a person, the owner of said animal shall immediately notify the city ~~or~~ and the county. An officer or the county animal control authority shall order the animal held in quarantine on the owner's premises or shall have it impounded and quarantined by the county for a period of not less than ten (10) days if there is no proof of current rabies inoculation.

6. Any animal that is placed under quarantine by the city or the county shall be kept separated from any other animals or people other than the owner's family or pets for a period of not less than ten (10) days.

C. Animal Housing and Restraint. If appropriate to the type of animal:

1. Animal housing structures shall be adequately constructed and maintained in good repair to protect both the animals and the public from injury, safely confine any animal housed therein, and prevent entry of other animals that may be dangerous to the animals within the enclosure.

2. Housing structures shall be dry and adequately sealed to prevent cold air and moisture from entering the enclosure. The primary enclosure for animals shall be of sufficient size to permit each animal housed therein to stand freely, sit, turn about and lie in a normal position, unless not warranted for specific commercial purposes.

3. Confinement areas shall provide protective shading and adequate shelter areas designed to minimize harmful exposure to weather conditions for those animals not acclimatized to the environment.

4. When restraining devices are used in connection with a confinement area intended to permit movement outside the housing structure, such devices shall be adequate in strength and installed in a manner to prevent entanglement with the devices of other animals or objects, and shall be fitted to the animal by a harness or well-fitted collar, other than a choke type collar, and shall not be shorter than three times the length of the animal as measured from the tip of its nose to the base of its tail.

5. Physical control devices must be used with animals, except cats or birds, when off or outside the property of the owner unless the animal is field trained to respond to verbal or hand command.

D. Number of Dogs Permitted. A maximum number of three adult dogs and their offspring of any number up to the age of 6 months may be kept on each residential lot. No more than one female dog may be used for breeding purposes at any one time.

E. Running at Large Prohibited. No dog shall be permitted to run at large.

F. Minimum Care. No owner shall maintain a dog without providing minimum care.

Section 7. Section § 5 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.050 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.050, to read as follows:

6.04.050 - Prohibited activities.

A. Animals at Large. It shall be unlawful for an owner to permit, either by negligence or by intention, any animal to run at large, except cats or birds.

B. Dangerous Animals. **It shall be unlawful to keep in the city any animal that is dangerous without a dangerous dog permit issued by the City pursuant to the requirements in subsection D of section TMC 6.04.110.** ~~It shall be unlawful to keep in the city any animal that is dangerous without being properly contained and restrained.~~

~~1. An animal shall be deemed dangerous if it causes or attempts to cause physical injury or death of any person or other animal:~~

~~a. while at large, or~~

~~b. when it is on the property of the owner, but not restrained or contained in a manner that would reasonably prevent incidental contact by any person, or~~

~~c. when it is in or on a motor vehicle and not restrained or otherwise physically prevented from reaching any area outside the perimeter of the vehicle.~~

~~2. An animal shall not be classified as dangerous, even if the animal has engaged in these behaviors, upon a determination that the behavior was caused by abuse or torment of the animal, or criminal activity on the part of any victim.~~

~~3. No dog shall be found to be dangerous or aggressive if it is a dog trained for law enforcement purposes and is on duty under the control of an officer.~~

C. **Public Nuisances. It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the city any animal that has been deemed a public nuisance pursuant to TMC 6.04.130.** ~~It shall be unlawful to keep or maintain within the city any animal that is a nuisance. An animal is a nuisance if it:~~

~~1. Causes repeated or prolonged disturbances by barking or noise making, plainly audible from inside any neighboring building, vehicle or residence, or~~

~~2. Damages or destroys property of a person other than that of the animal owner, or~~

~~3. Molests, attacks, menaces, or otherwise interferes with persons or other animals on property other than the owner's property.~~

D. **Illegal Killing.** Except as allowed by statute or state regulation:

1. No person shall knowingly kill an animal not owned by that person without the permission of the owner, unless it is necessary for the protection and safety of people, other animals, or the euthanasia of a sick or injured animal.

2. No person shall knowingly place food of any description containing poison or other injurious ingredients in any area reasonably likely to be accessible to any animal.

3. No person shall set any traps that are designed to kill, injure or maim an animal.

Section 8. Section § 6 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.060 is repealed, and replaced with the following in § 6.04.060, to read as follows:

6.04.060 – Impoundment. ~~Impounding Procedures.~~

The animal control officer or law enforcement officer may impound a dog that is in violation of this code for a period of time hereinafter specified. A daily record of dogs shall be kept at the place of impoundment and shall be made available to the public.

A. **Notice.** The animal control officer or law enforcement officer shall personally notify the owner of the dog of the impoundment. If the animal control officer or law enforcement officer is unable to contact the owner or if the owner of the dog impounded is not reasonably ascertainable at

the time of impoundment, the animal control officer shall immediately notify the owner by certified mail, return receipt requested sent to the owner's last known address. The notice of impoundment shall inform the owner of the day that he or she may request, in writing, a hearing to contest the impoundment within 5 business days of receipt of notice.

B. Period of impoundment:

1. An unlicensed dog or a dog for which the owner is unknown which has not been redeemed within 72 hours after impoundment will be deemed property of the animal shelter, or may be sold or humanely euthanized.

2. A licensed dog or a dog for which the owner is known, which has not been redeemed within 120 hours of notification of the owner by telephone contact or by mailing of the impoundment notice may be deemed property of the animal shelter, or may be sold or humanely euthanized.

C. Fee. A fee charged against the owner of a dog who has been impounded shall be in the amount set by Council resolution.

D. Redemption. Redemption of impounded dogs shall be made by exhibiting satisfactory proof that the person is the owner, and by paying the following required fees and charges:

1. Impoundment fee;

2. Daily care fee;

3. License and rabies vaccination fees, if required; and

4. Medical care fees, if required.

E. Costs. Any costs associated with the impoundment of an animal are the owner's responsibility. Any unusual or extraordinary expenses incurred in the enforcement of this ordinance are the responsibility of the animal owner or other responsible party.

F. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control or law enforcement officer pursuant to this section must state the information set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance except that the written appeal must be received by the City within 5 business days of receipt of the notice of impoundment. For the purposes of this section, receipt of the notice of impoundment is complete 3 days after mailing or immediately upon personal notice. An owner of the impounded dog may request a hearing be held within 10 business days after receipt of the request for hearing. Otherwise, the City Council shall hold a meeting within 30 days of receipt of the notice to determine if a violation of this ordinance occurred by a preponderance of the evidence. If the Council determines that a violation of this ordinance did not occur, the dog shall be immediately released back to the owner and no impoundment charges shall be made. The decision of the Council is final.

G. If a notice of appeal has not been timely filed or if dog which has not been redeemed after 5 business days of notification of the owner if known, or within 5 business days after impoundment if the owner is not known, the dog may be deemed property of the animal shelter, sold, or humanely euthanized.

H. No impoundment charge shall be made for dogs released after the City Council's determination that no violation of this ordinance has occurred.

~~A. — Violations. Any animal which is running at large, a public nuisance, diseased or in an environment hazardous to its health, dangerous, improperly housed or restrained, in violation of quarantine restrictions, not permitted in the city limits, sick, injured or dead, is unlicensed, or as otherwise provided herein, is or may be in violation of this ordinance, and~~

~~1. May be directed by an officer to be impounded by the county and placed in an animal facility. An officer, at their sole discretion, may also direct that the animal be impounded or quarantined by the owner at an alternate location.~~

~~2. Any animal allowed to be placed in alternate quarantine or impoundment shall be subject to the same hearing and judicial requirements set forth or imposed on animals impounded at the county.~~

~~3. Animals impounded by the county will be disposed of in accordance with the procedure provided by county ordinance for the disposition of impounded animals.~~

~~4. Any officer shall have the right of entry upon private land in the course of the officer's duties in enforcing the provisions of this ordinance, but such officer shall not enter into any building or dwelling without legal authorization or permission of the owner or occupant of the premises, except as required to protect life and property.~~

~~B. — Impoundment Notice. Whenever an animal is impounded pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, in case the owner or custodian of the animal is known to the person doing the impounding, that person shall forthwith give notice of the impounding by personal service or by registered or certified mail upon the owner or custodian. Said notice shall include the name and number of the impounding agency, the date, time and reason for the impound, the location of the impounded animal, the time limit for response, the process for redemption of the animal, and the penalty or disposition of the animal if no contact is made by the owner. If after reasonable search the owner or person having custody of such animal cannot be found and notified of the impoundment, such notice shall within seventy-two (72) hours after the impoundment be conspicuously posted on such premises at which the animal was impounded, or receiving care or housing, if such can reasonably be determined.~~

~~C. — Appeal. An animal owner may petition the court for the release of the animal. The court shall set a time and place for hearing the petition and notify the impounding officer. The court shall have full power to determine whether the animal should be returned to the owner and upon what terms, or other disposition of the animal.~~

~~D. — Costs. Any costs associated with the impoundment of an animal are the owner's responsibility. Any unusual or extraordinary expenses incurred in the enforcement of this ordinance are the responsibility of the animal owner or other responsible party.~~

Section 9. Section § 7 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.070 remains unchanged, to read as follows:

6.04.070 - Penalties.

A. Separate Violations. Each day's violation of any section of this ordinance constitutes a separate offense.

B. Violation of Sections. Violation of any section of this ordinance is a class "C" violation, unless otherwise specified.

C. Repeat Offenses. Second and subsequent violations of the same chapter of this ordinance that occur within a twelve month period are a class "B" violation, unless otherwise specified.

Section 10. Section § 8 of Ord. 1294 (2001) and Section § 6.04.080 is repealed, and replaced with the following in Section § 6.04.080, to read as follows:

6.04.080 - Dog Bites. Severability.

~~If any title, section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, phrase, clause, sentence or word of this ordinance shall, for any reason, be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect.~~

A. The owner of a dog that bites a human being shall immediately file a report with the animal control officer, which shall provide the time and circumstances of the bite and name and address of the person bitten, if known.

B. Any person who is bitten by a dog shall immediately file a report with the animal control officer describing such bite giving the description of the dog, the time and circumstances of the bite and the name and address of the dog owner, if known.

C. Upon notice of a dog bite, the animal control officer shall deliver written notice to the owner of the dog, if known. The owner shall thereupon be required to quarantine the dog for ten days.

D. An owner who is required to quarantine a dog shall:

1. Prevent the dog from being in contact with any other animal or person; or

2. At the owner's expense, quarantine the animal in a licensed veterinary hospital, local animal humane society, or a kennel approved by the City Manager, or designee.

E. If the dog exhibits symptoms of rabies, the owner or person in possession of the dog shall handle or dispose of the dog pursuant to ORS 433.345.

Section 11. Section § 6.04.090 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.090 - Determination of Status: Potentially Dangerous Dogs; Dangerous Dogs

A. The animal control officer may find and declare a dog potentially dangerous or dangerous if the officer has probable cause to believe that the dog falls within the definition of "dangerous dog" or "potentially dangerous dog". The finding must be based upon:

1. The written complaint of a person who is willing to testify that the animal has acted in a manner which causes it to fall within the definition of “dangerous dog” or “potentially dangerous dog”;

2. Dog bite reports filed with the animal control officer as required by City ordinance or state law;

3. Actions of the dog witnessed by any animal control officer or law enforcement officer; or

4. Other substantial evidence admissible in court.

B. A dog may be declared dangerous under this section if the dog has within a twelve-month period attacked or killed a household animal, or livestock on more than one occasion. For purposes of this subsection only, a household animal, or livestock does not include any feral animal or does not apply where the attack was upon a household animal, or livestock that was at large or upon a household animal, or livestock that was tormenting or attacking the dog.

C. The declaration shall contain the following information:

1. Name and address of the owner of the dog if known and if not known, that fact;

2. A description of the dog;

3. Whereabouts of the dog;

4. Facts upon which the declaration is based;

5. Restrictions placed upon the dog and when the owner is not known, the intended disposition of the dog;

6. Penalties for violation of the restrictions, including possibility of destruction of the animal and fine;

7. Availability of a hearing to contest the declaration by submitting a written request to the City Council within 15 business days of receipt of the declaration; or if the notice is given by publication or posting, within 15 business days of the earlier of the date of the notice first appears in the newspaper or the notice is posted.

D. Dogs shall not be declared dangerous or potentially dangerous if the threat, injury, or damage was sustained by a person who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner of the dog, or was tormenting, abusing, provoking or assaulting the dog or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused, provoked or assaulted the dog or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.

E. Notice.

1. The declaration shall be in writing, and shall be served by the animal control officer:

2. On the owner if known using one of the following methods:

a. Certified mail, return receipt requested to the owner’s last known address;

b. Personally; or

c. If the owner cannot be located by one of the first two methods, publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and posting a notice on the property of the owner;

3. Where the owner is not known: publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City.

4. When notice is given by certified mail, return receipt requested, notice is effective when received; provided however, if delivery has been refused, notice is effective by publication or posting and whenever notice is accomplished by publication or posting the notice is effective and deemed received on the earlier of the day the newspaper is published, or the property is posted.

F. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control officer pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

Section 12. Section § 6.04.100 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.100 - Potentially Dangerous Dog Restrictions.

A. No person may maintain a dog declared potentially dangerous dog in violation in this section.

B. No person owning, harboring, or having the care or custody of a potentially dangerous dog shall permit the dog to leave the owner's property unless the dog is securely leashed and muzzled. The dog may only be walked by a person who is both over the age of 18 and who has the physical ability to restrain the dog at all times

C. All owners of potentially dangerous dogs must spay or neuter the dog and provide proof of sterilization to the City within 21 days of the animal control officer declaring the dog potentially dangerous.

D. In addition to any other penalty for a violation under this ordinance, a court of competent jurisdiction may revoke the authority of a person to keep a potentially dangerous dog within the City.

E. The owner of a potentially dangerous dog may apply to the City Manager, or designee to have the declaration waived after 2 years upon meeting the following conditions:

1. The owner and offending dog have had no subsequent violations of this chapter of the code;

2. The owner of the dog has complied with all provisions of this act for a period of 2 years; and

3. The owner of the dog provides proof to the City Manager of successful completion of a behavior modification program administered by a Certified Pet Dog Trainer (CPDT), Certified Dog Behavior Consultant (CDBC), or Veterinary Behaviorist, certified through the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists (ACVB) or equivalent training.

If the City Manager, or designee finds sufficient evidence that the dog owner has complied with all conditions in this subsection, the application shall be forwarded to the City Council to rescind the potentially dangerous dog declaration during its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 13. Section § 6.04.110 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.110 - Dangerous Dog Restrictions.

- A. No person shall maintain a dog declared a dangerous dog in violation of this section.
- B. All owners of dangerous dogs must spay or neuter the dog and provide proof of sterilization to the City within 21 days of the animal control officer declaring the dog dangerous.
- C. Dangerous dog permit required. In addition to a dog license, every owner of a dangerous dog shall obtain a dangerous dog permit and renew such permit each year.
- D. Issuance. The City Manager, or designee shall issue a dangerous dog permit upon application on a form prescribed by the City, payment of the license fee, and upon finding that:
1. The dog has been issued a certificate of vaccination for rabies, valid for the entire period in which the license is sought;
 2. The dog has been spayed or neutered and the owner has provided proof of sterilization;
 3. The owner of the dangerous dog has procured liability insurance or a surety bond in the amount of not less than \$100,000 covering any damage or injury that may be caused by such dangerous dog. The policy shall contain a provision requiring that the City be notified immediately by the agent issuing it if the insurance policy is canceled, terminated or expired. The dog owner shall sign a statement attesting that he or she shall maintain and not voluntarily cancel the liability insurance during the lifetime of the dangerous dog;
 4. The dangerous dog is at all times kept or maintained in a safe manner and is at all times confined securely under the provisions of this section so that keeping the dangerous dog will not constitute a danger to human life or property;
 5. Adequate safeguards are made to prevent unauthorized access to the dangerous dog by a member of the public; and
 6. The quarters in which the dangerous dog is kept or confined are adequately lighted and ventilated and are so constructed that the animal can be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and the well-being of the dangerous dog is not in any way endangered by the manner of keeping or confinement.
- E. Inspection. Prior to the initial issuance and renewal of a dangerous dog permit, the animal control officer shall inspect the premises subject to the license to determine if the owner of the dog complies with all of the conditions specified under this section. In addition, the animal control officer shall have the authority to inspect the premises upon the receipt of any complaint regarding the maintenance of such premises or the dog therein. If the animal control officer determines during the inspection, that any of the conditions specified under this section are being violated, the

officer shall not issue **a written decision to the owner to not issue** a dangerous dog permit unless the violation is corrected within a period of time the officer shall direct not to exceed 30 days.

F. Fee. The permit fee shall be a fee of \$100 for each dangerous dog maintained on the premises subject to the permit.

G. In no event shall a dangerous dog permit be issued or renewed for the keeping of more than 2 dangerous dogs at any single location.

H. Appeal. An appeal of a decision of the animal control officer pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

I. Once a dog has been declared dangerous, it shall be kept in a secure enclosure subject to the following requirements:

1. Except when properly leashed and muzzled as provided in this section, a dangerous dog shall be securely confined inside a residence or confined in a locked pen or other secure enclosure that is suitable to prevent the entry of children and is designed to prevent the dog from escaping. The enclosure shall include shelter and protection from the elements and shall provide adequate exercise room, light and ventilation. The enclosure structure shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and shall meet the following requirements:

a. The structure must have secure sides and a secure top, or all sides must be at least six feet high;

b. The structure must have a bottom permanently attached to the sides or the sides must be buried not less than one foot into the ground; and

c. The structure must be of such material and closed in such a manner that the dog cannot exit the enclosure on its own.

The dog shall remain within the residence or enclosure except as necessary for the dog to receive veterinary care or exercise.

2. Signs. All owners or keepers of dangerous dogs shall display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public using the words, "Beware of Dog."

3. Leash. The dangerous dog shall not be allowed outside its proper enclosure unless the dog is securely attached to a leash not more than four feet in length and walked by a person who is both over the age of 18 and who has the physical ability to restrain the dog at all times. No owner shall keep or permit a dangerous dog to be kept on a chain, rote or other type of leash outside its enclosure unless a person capable of controlling the dog is in physical control of the leash.

4. Muzzle. The dangerous dog shall not be allowed outside of its proper enclosure unless it is wearing a properly fitted muzzle to prevent it from biting humans or other animals. Such muzzle shall not interfere with the dog's breathing or vision.

J. Notification of Escape. The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall notify the City immediately if such dog escapes from its enclosure or restraint and is at large. Such notification shall also be required if the dog bites or attacks a person or another animal.

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K. Failure to Comply. It shall be a separate offense to fail to comply with the restrictions in this section. Any dog found to be in violation of this section shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment pursuant to section 6.04.060 of this Ordinance. In addition to any other penalty for failure to comply with the requirements and conditions set forth in this ordinance, a court of competent jurisdiction may revoke the authority of a person to keep a dangerous dog within the City.

L. A dangerous dog owner may apply to the City Manager, or designee to have the dangerous dog declaration waived after 3 years upon meeting the following conditions:

1. The owner and offending dog have had no subsequent violations of this chapter of the code;

2. The owner of the dog has complied with all provisions of this chapter for a period of 3 years; and

3. The owner of the dog provides proof to the City Manager of successful completion of a behavior modification program administered by a Certified Pet Dog Trainer (CPDT), Certified Dog Behavior Consultant (CDBC), or Veterinary Behaviorist, certified through the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists (ACVB) or equivalent training.

4. If the City Manager, or designee finds sufficient evidence that the dog owner has complied with all conditions in this subsection, the application shall be forwarded to the City Council to rescind the dangerous dog declaration at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 14. Section § 6.04.120 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.120 - Livestock.

A. Complaint Based Response. Administrative and enforcement responses under this chapter are intended to be initiated on the basis of a complaint. Complaints may be filed by members of the public, by representatives of the city organization and by representatives of external agencies in a manner that shall be consistent with administrative operating guidelines. Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. No person shall cause or allow the keeping of any livestock on real property within the City contrary to the provisions of this chapter.

B. Prohibited Animals. No person shall cause or allow the keeping of the following animals on real property within the City:

1. Swine;

2. Rosters over the age of 6 months;

3. Peafowl;

4. Exotic animals; or

5. Wild animals.

C. Permissible animals. Persons may cause or allow animals on real property within the City, including:

1. Horses, cows, llamas, sheep, and goats.
2. Miniature horses and pygmy goats; and
3. Chickens

D. Inspection and approval. The animal control authority, or designee, shall inspect livestock upon receipt of a complaint, and whether premises where livestock is kept are adequate, upon finding that:

1. The premises where the livestock will be kept are maintained in a sanitary condition and adequately enclosed from other persons' property.

2. The premises lie not less than 100 feet from any structure used for human occupancy or, in the alternative, the occupant and owner of such structure have agreed in writing to the applicant's keeping of livestock.

3. The premises where the livestock will be kept do not violate any City zoning or development ordinances; and

4. The barn, stable, chicken coop or other similar confinement area, as defined in this ordinance, will not cause an odor noticeable at the property line of the property; and

5. The keeping of livestock does not otherwise violate this ordinance.

E. Failure to comply with any provision of this ordinance, obtain a permit, determination, or other approval, where one is required by the Code, shall constitute a nuisance and a civil infraction. Violation of any provision of the Code or a city-issued permit enforced under this chapter may constitute grounds for revocation, nonrenewal or denial of a permit issued by the city.

D. Any violation of the code, state law or a city-issued permit that is actionable under this chapter shall constitute a civil infraction and a nuisance.

Section 15. Section § 6.04.130 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.130 – Public Nuisance.

A. An animal shall be a public nuisance under the meaning of this chapter in the following instances:

1. The number of animals maintained on any premises is found to exceed the number allowed by this chapter.

2. The animals or group of animals make loud or frequent noises that disrupt the comfort or repose of persons in accordance with a reasonable person standard.

3. The animal which through the negligence of the owner fails to maintain the animal premises in a sanitary manner to a degree that offensive odors can be detected from an adjoining street, yard, or residential unit.

4. The animal habitually escapes confinement and trespasses on private property other than its owner's or on public right-of-way.

5. The animal is found running at large.

6. The animal chases persons or vehicles on premises other than premises from which the owner of the animal may lawfully exclude others.

7. The animal damages or destroys property of persons other than the owner of the animal.

8. The animal scatters garbage on premises other than premises from which the owner of the animal may lawfully exclude others.

9. The animal bites any person or animal while unprovoked.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person being the owner of any animal to permit the animal to be a public nuisance as defined in this chapter.
- B. Any person in violation of this section is subject to a penalty in an amount set by Council resolution. In addition, the City Council may direct the removal of any animal or group of animals from the City which are deemed to be a public nuisance.
- C. An appeal of a decision pursuant to this section must follow the appeals procedure set out in section 6.04.140 of this ordinance.

Section 16. Section § 6.04.140 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.140 – Appeals.

A. Unless otherwise specifically provided under subsection F of section 6.04.060, any person aggrieved by a decision of the animal control officer, or designee under this ordinance, may seek review of the decision by filing a written appeal with the City Council not more than 15 business days after receiving notice of the decision. The written appeal shall state:

- 1. The name and address of the appellant;
- 2. The reason given by the City for its decision; and
- 3. The reason the determination is incorrect.

4. In addition to the above, an appeal of a decision regarding whether premises where livestock is kept are adequate, the written appeal must also include:

a. A description of the livestock being kept or desired to be kept and the facilities for the livestock; and

b. A map showing the location of the livestock structures in relation to the property lines, abutting properties and all structures used for human occupancy;

B. The City Council shall hold a meeting within 30 days of a timely and complete written appeal to hear and determine the appeal on the basis of the appellant's written statement and any additional evidence the Council deems appropriate. If the Council decides to take oral argument or evidence at the hearing, the appellant may present testimony and oral argument personally or by counsel. The rules of evidence as used by courts of law do not apply. The appellant shall have the burden of proving the error in the animal control authority's or animal control officer's determination. The City Council shall issue a written decision within 20 business days of the hearing date. The Council's decision is final.

Section 17. Section § 6.04.150 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.150 – Severability Clause.

A determination of invalidity or unconstitutionality by a court of competent jurisdiction of any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts to this ordinance.

Section 18. Section § 6.04.160 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.160 – Savings Clause.

A prosecution that is pending on the effective date of this ordinance and arose from a violation of an ordinance repealed by this ordinance, or a prosecution started within one year after the effective date of this ordinance arising from a violation of an ordinance repealed by this ordinance, shall be tried and determine exactly as if the ordinance had not been repealed.

Section 19. Section § 6.04.170 is added, to read as follows:

6.04.170 – Emergency Clause.

This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public welfare, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
